#7 Inge Vinck - architecten de vylder vinck taillieu

Essential Reading is a project that aims to enlarge, diversify and enrich Kunstenbibliotheek's book collection. Which books are, today, really indispensable for an art library? Guests of Essential Reading bring together and present in the library the books they consider most valuable in their life and work.

architecten de vylder vinck taillieu

architecten de vylder vinck taillieu – a dvvt– is since 2009 the name under which Jan De Vylder, Inge Vinck and Jo Taillieu share their mutual interests and previous realized work. Already long before each one of them, sometimes in collaboration with each other, steadily developed and realized a certain variety of projects. Since 2009 it is clear that a dvvt has given wings to the united view on what architecture can possibly be. a dvvt wants to be complete, wants to embrace not only design but also the making; this is the point of departure for a dvvt. Only through understanding how something is created, design is able to play out its critical attitude. Within the landscape of present-day expectations, a dvvt unexpectedly wants to give an appropriate turn through which not only what is expected is granted, but more can be found.

a dvvt was selected for different international architecture exhibitions ao the Architecture Exhibition- La Biennale di Venezia of 2010 (curated by Kazuyo Sejima). In 2016 a dvvt curated BRAVOURE, the Flemish contribution to the Venice Architecture Biennale, together with Doorzon

architecten and Filip Dujardin. In 2018 a dvvt won the Silver Lion at the 16th International Architecture Biennale in Venice for their project CARITAS (Melle), as part of the exhibition Free Space curated by Yvonne Farrell and Shelley McNamara.

Essential Reading #7 is on view at Kunstenbibliotheek from 25 October until 26 November 2018.
